Shake It Up

Get your students moving. Invite them to do the following activity:

Ask your students to please stand to get their blood flowing. Have them jog in place for 1 minute. When they are done, have them say, "I am grateful!"



Talk It Out

Encourage your students to reflect on the provided questions.

Do It! (individually + as a class)

Invite your students to do the following:
